

STAY (Successful Transitional Avenues for Youth) is the name for the Lanark County organization we are working with to alleviate youth homelessness in our area. Executive director, Ann Emon, has spoken to our congregation several times, and the Church Council has been deeply involved in this local initiative to start a 'warming centre' at Trinity in January of 2013. The pieces are all coming together, and we are looking forward to being part of this community response to a true local crisis. It is a great opportunity for service and leads us into a deeper relationship with some of the most 'at-risk' people in our town. We need prayers and good wishes, and we also need a few supplies (bedding and soap to name a couple). There are opportunities for volunteering....good news for the night-hawks in our congregation! Along the way, we will learn what it means to be young and homeless in our town...a disturbing reality. What better way to deepen our understanding of Jesus' fragile and itinerant life as a young man in Galilee long ago. Keep an eye out for further announcements regarding all of this!

Your Church Council has some updates to share with you:

The Implementation Team who spent many hours of time and labour leading up to and during our major renovation are now recognized in a plaque accompanying the congregational Recognition Wall hanging in the church hall. This plaque will now form part of an historical record of these dedicated individuals under the leadership of Project Manager, Tom Foulkes. Many thanks to Mark White for creating both the Recognition Wall and its sister plaque. We are grateful for Mark's talent.

The Council continues to review the Trinity Policy & Procedures Manual and to include those policies set out by the United Church of Canada from time to time.

As the Council looks to 2013 there is some concern as to our financial position. Simply put, our expenses exceed our revenue. Our Treasurer, Larry Allan and the Stewardship Team are examining all avenues for cost-saving measures. Each team is examining their budgets for 2013 with a view to minimizing expenses. Ideally, it is revenue that needs to increase. Please give this your prayerful consideration.

This article really doesn't provide enough space to talk about our religious and spiritual experiences. We were very appreciative of all the prayers for our safety while we were away, but in all honesty, we never felt unsafe; uncomfortable, yes, but never unsafe. Our discomfort was due to the difficult political, religious and geographic realities that exist in Israel today, as Brenda eloquently put it, "It is a fragile peace". We hope to present our trip in the new year once we have organized our photos and taken the time to digest all that we have seen, heard, and experienced.

Israel trip



From October 10-25 Brenda Swan and I followed, if haphazardly, in the footsteps of Jesus, on a guided tour of Israel.

We travelled with Rostad Tours and our Canadian tour leaders were a United Church minister, Richard Hall and his wife Barbara. Richard helped co-ordinate our days with our local guide, told a daily joke-some were real groaners and led us in meaningful site-related worship. Barbara made sure that it all happened and took photos. The local tour company, Shepherd Tours, provided a bus, driver, and a local guide. Our driver,

Taleb Al-Laloti, drove with expertise in all situations: traffic jams, check points, windy and twisty roads, narrow alleyways, and busy market streets on market day. He did it all with courtesy and finesse and he made us laugh. Basem Sabat, our guide was Palestinian Christian and his biblical knowledge and theology should earn him the title the Reverend and an honorary doctorate in theology. These people helped to make our trip meaningful.

We stayed in Tel Aviv, Nazareth, Tiberias, Jericho, and Jerusalem. From these points we traveled to the various sites where Jesus traveled and stayed, healed and taught, was born, died, and rose again. We went to various Roman ruins, ancient Jewish and Moslem holy sites including Mount Hebron, the Tomb of the Patriarchs where Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, Rebecca and Jacob and Leah are buried, and the Dome of the Rock.

The weather was very hot and Besam told us that in the area of Jericho the weather was 10° hotter than it usually was at this time of year. We didn't realise it would be so humid with desert surrounding this oasis. The Jordan River and the Dead Sea cause this humidity that even reaches the top of Masada and Qumran that are desert elevations in the wilderness.

The Council has partnered with an organization, Successful Transitional Avenues for Youth (STAY), to offer our gym space for free as a "warming centre" for homeless youth for three days a week during the winter months. A staff person from STAY along with two trained volunteers will oversee the clients. A Memo of Understanding setting out the responsibilities of STAY and Trinity will be in place by opening of the centre. For more information about STAY visit www.stay-lanark.com. There is a significant need for emergency housing for youth in Lanark County and we are excited to be partnering with the Town of Smiths Falls and the community on this initiative.

In 2013, Rev. Woods announced that he will be taking a three month sabbatical starting in September. The Council supports his decision and accordingly a request to Presbytery has been made for their approval.

Church Council meets five times a year. The meetings commence at 7:00 p.m. and are open to anyone who would like to attend. In 2013 our meeting dates will be Tuesday, February 5, March 26, June 18, September 24 and November 26. If you have

QUEEN ELIZABETH II DIAMOND JUBILEE MEDALS

The medals were presented to Doug Kilpatrick and Ron Stronski by Scott Reid, MP and Randy Hillier MPP, for the ridings of Lanark-Frontenac-Lennox and Addington in the Perth Civitan Hall on the afternoon of November 16th, 2012.

From over 120 nominees in the riding, 42 recipients were selected by an evaluation committee, of whom 9 were from Smiths Falls. The award criteria were fairly broad and Mr. Reid said "The Diamond Jubilee Medal ought to honour those Canadians whose own lives have paralleled Her Majesty's personal history of giving back to the community".

On receiving notice of the award, Doug Kilpatrick said his first reaction was surprise because he could immediately think of a half-dozen persons in Smiths Falls who are at least equally deserving. He said he was certain he met at least one criterion, that of being alive when QE II ascended the Throne. Doug also spoke of the honour he felt in being in the company of so many highly deserving recipients. He's also honoured to be a recipient with military Warrant Officers and Senior Non-Commissioned Officers. From his years in the Regular Army, he knows that these are the people who make the Forces "tick".

Doug thinks that there should be an official way of sharing the award with "better halves".

Ron Stronski commented that he was overwhelmed and proud to accept this award. Ron is a monarchist of Polish-Ukrainian descent. He was nominated as being the Town Council's conscience and instigating the Sports Hall of Fame. Over the years Ron has been on many fund raising committees and is noted for his silent auctions. Ron also has sat on many boards with the current ones being Crime Stoppers and the Drug Strategy and is also a Mason & a Shriner and a clown. He is often called to answer questions on the history of the town and surrounding areas.

The Board of Trustees did not accept the offer of \$225,000 for the property.

We have a very high rating at the Bank of Nova Scotia and have the best percentage available on our investments.

Our financial stability as a Church congregation is secure with keeping the property.

A motion was made that the property value be looked at in 2014.
