
Vision and Mission Statements of the Four Rivers Presbytery

Opportunities in 2014 will include the Council learning more about Affirming Ministries in the United Church. Many Conferences, Presbyteries and UCW Presbyterials have completed a process of discernment and reflection on what it means to be inclusive and justiceseeking. They have prepared a statement of faith and vision that sets out their ongoing commitment to work for justice on issues of gender diversity and sexual orientation within their congregation, the wider church and their community and to support and participate in the Affirming Ministry Program. UPDATE

Board of Trustee members are Bob Swan (Chairman), Stewart Graham (Treasurer), Muriel Dillabough (Secretary), David Johnston (Member) and Ron VanMeer (member). All current members have agreed to remain on the Board for 2014. However we certainly would welcome additional members to join the "team". Please speak to me if you would consider becoming a member of the "Board".

Your Board of Trustees has held two meetings since the last report for the Communicator. The following update is provided:

• Firstly, I must correct an error that I made in the Thanksgiving Communicator when I reported that the sum of "Funds Held in Trust" was \$76,536.19. The sum should have read \$78,523.19. Notwithstanding, the sum of "Funds held in Trust" continues to drop. As of November 29, 2013 the total of Funds held in Trust is \$78,153.98, with approximately \$15,000.00 as designated funds. \$72,000.00 is held in two GICs which do not mature until 2014. The balance of \$6153.98 is accessible funds. A final detailed report for 2013 will be presented in

- I am pleased to report that the Church has received a very much welcomed "Gift of Life Insurance" which has been earmarked for and passed to the General Fund. Notwithstanding, there certainly is a requirement to rebuild Trinity's "Funds Held in Trust". You never know when an unexpected emergency might occur.
- Trustees continue to work on a "Legacy Giving Program" to re-build the Church's "Funds held in Trust". You will hear more about this initiative as the program is developed. The Trustees are working with Mr. Paul Sales who is the United Church of Canada's Quebec & Eastern Ontario Regional Finance Development Officer.

Trinity's Choir presents the story of Christmas through song and verse. Free will offering. Seasonal treats and fellowship to follow in the church hall.


Dec. 22, Sunday – Christmas Pageant A pageant style service full of music and the nativity story as told with the help of Children's Ministry.
