The people behind the Comprehensive Review have drafted a proposal that is worthy of your attention. There are parts that make perfect sense, and there are elements that leave me very frustrated. I trust you will find yourself responding in a similar fashion. UNITED IN GOD'S WORK.

This document is an abstract of a 2-page summary written by Rev. Cathy Hamilton, Chair of Comprehensive Review Task Group.

The Comprehensive Review Task force has released its recommendations in "United in God's work" for the 42 General Council 2015,

The report proposes that

- the church commit 10% of its annual givings to M & S fund to support new ministries and new forms of ministry.
- place a high priority on building a relationship between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people
- replace the current four-court system by a three councils model of communities of faith (congregations and new forms of ministry), regional councils (replacing Presbyteries and Conferences) and a denominational council (replacing General Council).
- establish a College of Ministers to accredit, oversee and discipline ministers.
- study the concept of Associations of Ministers
- reduce spending by at least \$11 million.

This comprehensive-review-report is about vitality in the church as well as financial and structural changes. All members are encouraged to read the report "United in God's Work" ,watch the short videos, and discuss the recommendations in their churches.
