Greetings From Your Church Council

Your Church Council continues to meet monthly (except in the summer) to fulfill the responsibilities as a governing body of Trinity United, Smiths Falls. Each month the Teams report to Council on the activities and progress of their ministries as envisioned through their Narrative Budgets as approved at the last Annual Congregational Meeting in February.

In order to further educate the congregation on the work of the Teams, a Ministry Fair was held in May with each Team providing a showcase display of what their Team does. The Fair was left on display in the Church Hall for the month of May for viewing at leisure.

Further to a discussion point during the Annual Congregational Meeting in February 2018 regarding the Bell Avenue vacant property that Trinity owns, the Board of Trustees was tasked with providing a report to Council. The full report was presented at our June Council meeting.

The Council concurred with the recommendation of the Board of Trustees to NOT sell the Bell Avenue property at this time or sell off any portion thereof in order to maintain the current configuration for any potential future sale. A summary of the report presented to Council is outlined separately in this edition of The Communicator.

Upcoming work of the Council will include the review of the Teams' Narrative Budgets for 2019. If anyone has a suggestion as to future initiatives, programs, or fundraising that Trinity could undertake, please advise the Council in writing or email to the Council Chair or Secretary at: council@trinityunitedsf.ca so it can be forwarded to the appropriate Team.

As always, the Nomination Team is actively seeking to add members and leadership to the Teams. Currently, the Treasurer is seeking a successor and for anyone interested, training will be provided. Also too, there is a need for another couple of audio/ techies so that our Sunday services can continue to be taped for Cogeco and YouTube. This is a great opportunity for a student to earn their mandatory volunteer hours if you know of someone.

If you have an interest in any of the Ministry Teams, their meetings are open if you wish to attend and check out what goes on. Just advise the Team Chair in advance. The Church Directory has the Council and Team contact particulars and can be found on the bulletin boards at the front entrance and outside the church office.

Options for the Bell Avenue Property

This is a summary of the full report of the Board of Trustees to Council as contained in the Council minutes for 21 June 2018:

Assisted Living: Too enormous an undertaking and it is the Trustees' view that this is out of the congregation's capacity (energy, expertise and financial resources) to undertake. Such facilities are governed by government legislation.

Sell the property now and invest the funds for use as the church requires. At this time there is no congregation/Council plans within the church's ministries that require the sale of the property in order to provide needed funds. Selling the property does not seem to be the most prudent option.

Hold the property – Property values are on the increase and there is a significant upturn in Smiths Falls land values. The property is attractive to developers and the Trustees think it best to have a developer come to the church with an offer rather than the church go looking for a buyer. Investment income and dividends earned over the past two years has more than covered the cost of municipal taxes.

The Council concurred with the recommendation of the Board of Trustees to NOT sell the Bell Avenue property at this time or sell off any portion thereof in order to maintain the current configuration for any potential future sale.

The Power of Prayer

At the request of the Chair of the Communication Team, I am providing a verbatim account of my remarks to Bethel United at Rideau Ferry early in the summer. I believe I made similar comments during announcements in early Feb. 2018 at Trinity. As most of you know, I had significant heart issues from March 2017 to late December when a TAVI (trans aortic valve implant) procedure took place at Ottawa's internationally acclaimed Heart Institute. As I spend most of the summer at Otty Lake, I have been known to attend Bethel United a few times each summer. I have known a number of members through Lake Association, curling, and a number of service providers e.g. construction/maintenance etc. My remarks follow:

This is the 2nd Sunday in 2018 that Rev. Liz and I have both been here. The first time I was at an emotional high following being treated at the Heart Institute like royalty two days earlier; and the CTV news presentation on the Heart Institute, my heart, the walking track at Memorial Community Centre, Library, Trinity and Station Theatre in Smiths Falls. Today, I will speak about prayer requests and being the recipient of the same. In my experience, your prayer request system is unique – it works because of your size (building and your community) it reminds people of their neighbours and those who are facing challenges in their lives.

I understand that I was in your prayer requests in late November, December and into January of this year. The cards, calls (before, during and after my hospital stay) and the visits which I received while I recovered at the Van Horne in Smiths Falls were much appreciated. As a recipient they told me that people were interested. People cared – it provided me with courage, strength, sustenance – perhaps the best word – it sustained me – particularly before and after Christmas before my surgery/procedure, when I was pretty low.

I am here today because of the skills and expertise of the Heart Institute Team, Divine Intervention and the observations, forcefulness and efforts of my Guardian Angel.

I thank you for your support. It is very much appreciated. God Bless you all!! I heard — after the service "It was from the Heart and very emotional and touched us all" and so on!!

Trinity continues to host Rainbow Sabbath the second Friday of each month. Pot luck and fellowship beginning at 6:00 pm. All are Welcome!




Report from the Treasurer
