# Message from Rev. Christopher

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Matthew 6:25-33

Although this is a familiar passage, it was only in the consideration of it for Thanksgiving that this stood out – **"For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things"** 

What was the difference between Jewish and Greek thought that would cause Jesus to conclude that Gentile or Greek culture was inherently more anxious than that of the Jews?

One difference was the way the Jews and Greeks viewed their God or gods. For the Jews, Humankind was created from the earth by God in the Image of God. God is Creator and we are the Created. For the Greeks, gods are created by humans in the image of humans. Quite literally, crafts folk cast or carved or moulded gods from the earth with their own hands.

Another difference was the way the Jews and Greeks viewed their own nature. For the Jews, each person was a single entity. Body, mind, soul and spirit were one. There was little sense of internal strife or battle between one aspect of being and another. For the Greeks, each individual lived in a state of internal conflict. Most notably was the struggle between the passions and reason.

How does this relate to worry, anxiety and thanksgiving?

For the Jews, Divine relationship and fullness of life are **received** as gifts and life is lived in balance.

For the Greeks, divine relationship and fullness of life are **achieved** by our own effort and life is lived in strife.

The Christian Church was born in two worlds, Jerusalem and Rome. Whether we are conscious of the fact or not, we are influenced by both. Thanksgiving is a time when we are encouraged to pause and remember that we are created in the image of God, life is a gift. Thanksgiving is a time to remember that our relationships within ourselves, with the created order and each other are best lived in balance. Thanksgiving is a time to remember that **understanding our bounty as a gift received rather than an accomplishment achieved frees us from a burden of anxiety and worry**.

Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

How true this was this past 19 months! Your Stewardship Team mustered through with a couple of fundraisers -Geranium Plants and Compost Sale. Thanks to your support, and that of the community beyond, we achieved a net profit of \$3,510. Special thanks to The REAL Deal Store who allowed Trinity to use their parking lot for our Compost sale throughout the summer. The Team extends appreciation to all the volunteers we had, from coordinating the compost purchase and delivery, digging and bagging some 800 30L bags during the hottest week in May and to staffing the sale site on weekends. We plan to hold both these fundraisers again next year and we will be looking for volunteers.

This summer our long serving Secretary, Barb Byam, has moved from Smiths Falls due to health reasons and the Team will miss her contribution of clerical skill and advice. This Secretary position is available if you have an interest in serving on the Stewardship Team. Please make your interest known to one of the Team members.

The Gift Card program was suspended early in 2021 as the office was closed during lockdown periods. As all cards have now been sold and funds used to meet expenses, the Stewardship Team and the Treasurer will recommend to Council that Trinity no longer participate in the program going forward. Given Trinity's financial position at this time, where Expenses continue to exceed Revenue, the outlay of further cash to fund the gift card purchase is not prudent. Thank you to everyone who supported the program over the years.

The Financial Task Team has continued to oversee the monthly financial statements and has worked with our Bookkeeper to maximize cost savings and minimize expenses where possible.

While Trinity begins to reopen to new opportunities of Ministry within the Trinity family and the community we serve, the Stewardship Team reminds us all of the abundance we enjoy of God's grace and how thankful we are for it.











# **Christian Community Team**
